## From the Ministry Team

## What is a good life?

Alan Crawley writes:

The Bible offers us a way to live a good life. I often explain the rules in the Bible by saying that when we tell a child not to put their finger in the plug or they will get electrocuted we are not threatening them, but warning them. And my experience is that that is also true of the Bible – they are there to tell us what is good for us, or what was good for us 2000+ years ago. Of course, there are rules which were good for us 2000+ years ago which are no longer relevant, for example the food laws, now that we have the means to store and cook food safely.

So how do we live a good life today? If we look at society there seems to be a decrease in the number of people belonging to groups of all kinds, and an increase in labelling others and ourselves; whether this be with neurodiversity, sexuality, gender, politics, or some other label. These labels can be helpful for gaining support or fellowship. However, labels can also be used to tightly define what is *right*, particularly on social media, where people do not really know each other, and can lead to the ostracising of those who disagree.

When people know each other, and love each other, allowances can be, and are, made for individual views, opinions and foibles. Instead of labelling others they are recognised lovingly as "that's just how Fred is, and we love him for it".





In an age of social media, where people engage with, and comment on, those they do not know these, allowances are not made; when 'Fred' is known they are.

In an era where we are inclined to hide our oddities to avoid abuse, it takes courage and time to truly be ourselves with others, but the benefits of doing so are there.

If you identify with anything here, why not join something and start getting to know and love some more people?

## **Ordinations**

This year we have two people being ordained in the parish. Stella Wiseman is being ordained Priest on July 1<sup>st</sup>, and David Camp is being ordained Deacon on July 2<sup>nd</sup>, both at 10:30am in Guildford Cathedral. If you wish to attend a service either let them know (they will have a limited number of tickets), or you can try just turning up on a first-comefirst-served basis (there is plenty of room in the cathedral).

Stella will be presiding at her first communion service at 4pm on Saturday, July 1<sup>st</sup> at St Mark's, followed by a bring-and-share bun-fight, and we will welcome David back to St Mark's following the Sunday ordi-

nation service, probably at about 1.30pm, for another bring-and-share.

As a result, there will be some changes to what they do.

Stella will now be able to preside at communion, take weddings and baptize. She will be going on the rota to preside, and plans to preside twice monthly, once at St Mark's and once at one of the other churches, and when she is confident, the rota will change so that, on at least some Sundays, Lesley and I aren't running from St John's to St Mark's. However, during July

and August she will presiding more often, mainly at St Mark's, to gain experience and confidence.

#### **David**

David will be co-leading services and preaching once a month. As he has not yet got that well-known in the parish, we decided it would be good for him to spend a month at a time in each church, rather than moving around week to week. However, he will continue to work at his full time job, and his time in the parish will be

limited. This is particularly so as during the first year after ordination there is a lot of training to be done, and that is true whether you are in full time ministry or not, it just takes up a larger amount of your time if you are not.

Please pray for them both in the run-up to their ordinations, and for the parish as we learn new ways of working together.

# St George's celebrated the Coronation of King Charles III



Kris Lawrence reflects on the recent Coronation of King Charles III



Among all the pomp and pageantry of the King's coronation, there were two striking images that really stood out for me. The first was right at the start of coronation service where the single voice of a 14-year-old chorister, standing face to face with the King, spoke words of welcome. The words of Isaiah 11:6 came to mind: "The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; and the calf and the young lion and the fatling together; and a little child shall lead them".

Then, later in the service, Charles was disrobed from all his glorious ceremonial dress to stand in a simple attire of shirt and trousers. After his very private anointing, the screens were pulled back and there he was in his humility kneeling before the altar. There were other times during the service that revealed that

humble nature, but for me this was certainly the most powerful. And it's a reminder that we are all called to be humble servants for God. Matthew 20:28 says: "Just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve".

Those two images will remain with me beyond all others.





I never dreamt that I would be touched by the coronation of King Charles III, I had been deeply saddened by the passing of Queen Elizabeth II who was the only monarch many of us had even known. But the reality of life is that things move on and to be touched as I was by the coronation of King



Charles III was unexpected, but also somehow reassuring as we move forward into the 'Carolean' age.

We opted for a simple celebration at St George's – but this was definitely a matter of 'less is more'. The service itself was well attended. Lesley's sermon in which she spoke about love and service was perfect for the occasion.

After the service we had a lovely time of fellowship with scones, jam & cream (with the inevitable conversation around "jam first or cream first?"). We toasted the king with a glass of prosecco (or tea/coffee) ,we had bunting, crowns, even a silly game of pinning the diamond on the crown.

## Rebalance yourself with sound!

How sound therapy can help you relax and look after your wellbeing.

Soundbaths are growing in popularity as a way of looking after your health, having a wide range of therapeutic benefits for both the mind and body.

A soundbath generally involves the participants resting comfortably on the floor (or seated if needed) and listening to a complex tapestry of calming sounds created by a range of gently resonant instruments such as gongs, singing bowls, chimes and gentle percussion. You are bathed in subtle sounds which help to reset the mind and body and leave you feeling refreshed and rejuvenated after a session.

The soothing sounds slow down the mind's activity to a restful level which is similar to a dreamlike state, but still awake. This shuts off the stresses of the everyday world and gives the brain the peace and rest it needs to recalibrate itself. This can help with insomnia, tension, and anxiety. On a physical level our bodies come out of balance and the sounds help us rebalance ourselves to our natural frequency and equilibrium. Imagine bringing an out of tune guitar or violin back to its correct tuning. This can have far reach-

ing benefits, helping boost our immune system, lowering our blood pressure and heart rate and leaving us feeling deeply relaxed and more grounded. Sound therapy is a way of looking after your health in a preventative way and scientific research is constantly finding further evidence of its benefits.

No previous experience is needed and everything is explained to you clearly before a session.

I have the privilege of running regular soundbath sessions at St Mark's Church in Upper Hale on two Thursday evenings a month. I play a range of large gongs, a variety of singing bowls and other percussive instruments at the sessions. St Mark's is a beautiful location for the soundbaths, providing both a visually stunning setting and the building has amazing acoustics which make it a very special and unique sonic experience.
